In the southern Song dynasty, the patriotic general Yue Fei wrote The whole river turned red: "I just want to drive a chariot to break through the enemy camp on Helan Mountain. With great ambition, I will eat the flesh of the enemy hungrily. Talking with laughter, I will quench my thirst with the blood of the enemy. I will recaptuer the old rivers and mountains and return to the capital to report my success to the emperor." Here Yue Fei expressed his deep hatred for the enemy's invasion of the motherland and his ardent desire for the reunification of the motherland.

2.2 Humanistic Care Centered on Benevolence

This is essentially a kind of humanistic spirit. The core connotation of humanistic spirit is "paying attention to the realization of human value, carrying forward human reason and wisdom, and paying attention to the harmonious coexistence of soul and body". This humanistic care centered on benevolence is about the meaning and value of human existence.
